Circuit Court closed at Prineville last week, after a short session of only three days. Judge Lutenfeldt presided at this term, owing to the illness of Judge Bradshaw. The standing scope resulting from the claim between the Indians and sheepherders, and which was to be the most important case on the docket, was continued, none of the Indians appearing against the defendants. Colbert Holt, the Indian who was shot, was unable to appear, and the other two Indians did not appear to desire to do so. It is generally believed that the case will be dismissed at the next term of the court.


