

DIFFICULT TO BECOME CITIZEN

Foreigners are experiencing many difficulties in becoming citizens of the United States under our new naturalization laws, and especially in the larger cities where naturalization is sought by large numbers of aliens, and where special precautions are taken to see that they are entitled to citizenship.

In Portland last week objection was made to one witness on the ground that he was a saloonkeeper and not qualified to testify as to the character of an applicant, but Judge Cleland over-ruled this objection, saying that such testimony was received daily in all courts on matters of the highest importance.
