FOR COUNTY JUDGE

In another column the announcement of the candidacy of H. C. Ellis for the office of county judge is made. Mr. Ellis had no particular desire to enter the political race but at last agreed to do so after much urging by his friends. And the public should be congratulated in that Mr. Ellis has allowed his name to go before the voters for, if elected, he will make one of the very best judges the county has ever had.

Mr. Ellis possesses in a marked degree the qualifications necessary for a county judge. He is an attorney at law, having been admitted to the bar both in Illinois and Michigan. After having been admitted to the bar he took a year's course in the law school at Ann Arbor, the state university of Michigan, and graduated from that institution. Later he returned and took a two year's postgraduate course. Thus Mr. Ellis has the legal training that should be possessed by a county judge, the Michigan university ranking as one of the very best in the United States. He also pursued other studies at the University of Chicago.

Besides the legal training, Mr. Ellis has shown himself to possess good business ability, so necessary in one who is to have a hand in conducting county affairs. He is manager of the Pioneer Telegraph & Telephone Company, a corporation that is growing rapidly and is extending its lines throughout Central Oregon. His duties as manager of this company and as United States land commissioner have given him a wide acquaintance over the county, and the one significant feature of this acquaintance is that he commands the respect and friendship of people from every community. Mr. Ellis is sized up by those who know him as a clean man morally, a man of much ability and integrity. If the voters nominate and elect Mr. Ellis to the office of county judge, they will have an officer who will conduct the affairs of the county impartially and well. He will be a strong candidate before the people, and those who support him will be supporting a strong and able man.—Bend Bulletin.

REPRESENTATION FOR NORTHERN CROOK

It is apparently conceded in all sections of the county that Northern Crook should logically furnish the next county commissioner, who is to be elected next June, and there has been much skirmishing around in this section to secure a candidate for the office who would meet with the approval of the voters in all the other sections. The friends of Mr. Willis W. Brown of Heisler, believing that his candidacy for that office would meet with general approval and endorsement at the primaries, have urged him to enter the race for that office and it is understood that Mr. Brown has signified his willingness to do so. If such is the case, we believe that his candidacy will meet with popular approval. He is well known throughout the county as a man of fine character and splendid business ability, and as a member of the county court

could be depended upon to use his influence for a good, businesslike administration of the county's affairs. He is an old resident of the county, having for many years been engaged in the cattle business on Haycreek, near the Lyle & Brown gap, and in which he has been most successful. He is, geographically, correctly located to entitle him to election, as he is from the extreme northern portion of the county, which is unquestionably entitled to representation on the county court. The Pioneer hopes that the report of Mr. Brown's willingness to become a candidate will develop within the next few days into a definite announcement of his candidacy, as in our opinion there is no man in the county who could fill the position more acceptably to all the interests of the county.

Elsewhere in these columns we are publishing an editorial from the Bend Bulletin regarding the candidacy of Mr. H. C. Ellis of Bend for the Republican nomination to the office of county judge. Crook County would receive at his hands a good, clean, honest, businesslike administration of the office, and the Pioneer very gladly adds its endorsement of his candidacy. Mr. Ellis is quite well known in this section, and his friends all have a good word to say for his candidacy. He possesses the ability, the honesty and the business experience to make us an excellent county judge, and the voters of the county should nominate him and elect him by a big majority.

M. A. Lehman of Oneil has announced his candidacy for the Republican nomination for County Superintendent of Schools, his announcement appearing in another column. The office of county superintendent of schools seems to be the most sought after of any of the county offices this year, as there are already four candidates for that position.
