Returns Also Give New York State and City to Taft.

MISSOURI IS REPUBLICAN

Maryland Still in Doubt, but Vote Will Probably Be Split-Bryan Will Have 156 Votes.

New York, Nov. 5.-The membership of the electoral college which will choose the next president of the United States was still in doubt when the official counters in Maryland abandoned their task for the night.

According to the best information obtainable, the proportionate number of Republican and Democratic electors was determined by a division of Maryland's eight votes. Half of the city of Baltimore and two of the 23 counties outside that city are still to be counted, but there is a strong indication that the state's vote will be split. In any event, the margin of victory will be so small that the state was claimed tonight by the leaders of both parties. Though the splitting of a state's electoral college vote is unusual, it will be recalled that in 1904 Maryland chose one Republican and seven Democratic electors.

TAFT VOTE GROWS.

Oregon Returns Will Give Plurality of Nearly 25.000.

Portland, Nov. 6.-As official returns come in from the various counties of the state, Taft's plurality continues to grow, and it is almost certain that the first night's estimate of 25,000 will be verified.

Bryan's vote in each county exceeds that for Parker four years ago, and even Taft has in many instances re-ceived a bigger vote than that accord-47,166. ed Roosevelt. The November vote was not so heavy as that cast at the

June election. The minor parties will likely show a decrease when the final returns are all completed. In Lake county, Chafin received but one vote. Hisgen's vote in all counties is but a trifle. The Socialist voto is not what had been ex-

pected.

Portland, Nov. 5.-Multnomah county gave Taft a plurality of 7,949. County Clerk Fields yesterday completed the official count, which shows the following vote: Taft 17,819, Bryan 9,870, Chafin 630, Debs 1,455, Hisgen 45. The total number of votes cast against Taft in the county was 12,000, giving him a majority of 5,819.

Taft's plurality in the state of New York, according to corrected figures late tonight is 203,495, more than 28, 000 in excess of President Roosevelt's plurality of four years ago.

Governor Charles E. Hughes was reelected governor of New York by 71,-150. The returns as between president and governor indicate a heavy splitting of tickets. The proportion of scratched ballots was about the same in the up-state districts as in Greater New York.

Outside of the returns, political interest was engaged today in the exchange of messages of congratulation and thanks between Mr. Bryan and Mr. Taft; a statement by Mr. Bryan in which he sets forth his determination to continue his work for the good of all, in the capacity of a private citizen; and the announcement by Mr. Sherman that it cost him just \$2,800 to be elected vice president.
