What Scientific Farming Does

Remember, that the basic principle of scientific soil culture looks directly to the preparation of the soil for the highest and greatest efficiency, and that it means not only making sure of crops of every year—in the dryest as well as in the wettest—but still more important is that it means a greatly increased yield of crops in ordinary and most favorable years. In other words it is not merely drouth insurance, it is not merely to guard against dead failure—it is to make sure of crops in any season and bigger and better crops all the time in any climate.

On the other hand what we understand to be the dry farming system is based upon the experience of the Mormons in Utah of 40 years ago where they went up into the valleys and farmed under the common method and got good results because of the peculiar soil formation. They found that the volcanic ash soil of the Western slopes of the Rockies responded to ordinary culture and brought about with a little rain a condition of the seed bed which elsewhere must be produced by cultivation. This system was brought over the mountains to the Eastern slopes where the soil formation is entirely different. It aims almost solely at conservation of the moisture and takes little account of soil conditions.

Let us not be misunderstood in this matter so vital to the prosperity of a large section of our country. Some of these ideas may seem extreme to persons living in places where there have been good crops for a number of years. It is difficult for the individual who sticks close to his farm to appreciate the situation elsewhere; but we have traveled all over this region, on both sides of the mountains and from Mexico far up into Canada and have seen much that does not come to the ordinary observer. We know that here and there all over this region there are spots where a large per cent of the new settlers have moved out in sheer despair because of crop failures. These failures have come every year somewhere. But we all know that in practically every one of these places there are just a few who have gone right along doing successful farming, and doing it because they have grasped the true principles of scientific soil culture. We could cite many instances in support of this statement. The danger of failure is constant; the possibility of sure and safe farming depends upon knowing how.—H. W. Campbell in "Scientific Farmer."
