COMMENDABLE ACTIVITY

The efforts of Prosecuting Attorney Wilson to secure evidence upon which to base prosecutions for alleged violations of the prohibition law will be commended by all law-abiding citizens of the county. There may be some difference of opinion as to the best manner of dealing with the liquor question, but all good citizens will agree upon the enforcement of the law since it has been adopted.

At the June election in this county last year the question of prohibition was submitted under the local option law, and was adopted by a vote of nearly two to one, showing how strong is the prohibition sentiment in the county. But this strong public sentiment is a joke and the prohibition law is a rank farce, if "boot-legging" and other forms of the illicit sale of liquor are to be permitted without feeling the heavy hand of the law, and a worse condition will soon come to pass, than ever existed in the days of the open saloon. The prosecuting attorney has given evidence of his intention to conduct a vigorous campaign for law enforcement in this county, and in carrying out that intention he should have the support of every good citizen.

A MATTER OF TRANSPORTATION

A ranch of 2400 acres near Olex in Gilliam county sold last week for \$72,000, or \$30 an acre. This land is situated in the wheat district of Gilliam county, and is similar in character to the wheat lands of Morrow, Sherman and Crook counties, being semi-arid and devoted to the so-called "dry land farming." The land lies near the Condon branch of the O. R. & N. railroad, however, and that accounts for the difference in price between that land and land in this section. It is altogether a matter of transportation facilities.

A few years ago all of this land in the semi-arid counties of the state was begging at \$5 an acre, but it has been found that with proper cultivation good crops can be grown upon it, and that the expense of cultivation and care of the land is less than in other sections, so that in recent years the dry-farming districts are beginning to attract a great deal of attention. The science of dry land farming has made wonderful strides in the last few years, and given rail transportation, the districts in which dry land farming is practiced are today among the most prosperous sections of the state.

The Madras Pioneer is very positive of the Harriman system's intention to build up the Deschutes, and very sensibly points out the fact that the trade of the canyon itself is not the object of building. This paper wants to see a railroad built into Central Oregon, from any direction; but, it has also said, and will reiterate the assertion that Mr. Harriman has no intention of building up the Deschutes canyon. He never

has had, all talk to the contrary notwithstanding. He never will have until a road on the East slope of the Cascades is deemed imperative. He selected the Deschutes route knowing full well in advance that the Reclamation Service would hold up construction. The simple fact is that Harriman is not a railroad builder, but a railroad financier and dividend producer; that is how he holds his job.

So perhaps there will be no work done by the contractors this week or even next week. Just how long it will take to untangle the threads we do not know, but we look for no work to be done in the very near future.

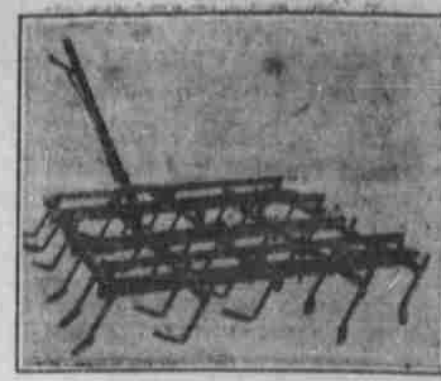
