On requesting the license of the county clerk Brunoa said: "This woman like this man, Get Fr. Brongeeet to make um tight." Father Brongeeet being out of town the two Indians were married by Justice J. A. Douthitt shortly after securing the license. The witnesses to the ceremony were Wasco Charley, an Indian, and Chief of Police J. H. Harper. Brunoa said he believed in marriage the same as white people and wished to have the ceremony performed according to law. This is the first marriage license issued to an Indian couple by County Clerk Ange.—The Dalles Optimist.
