INCORPORATE

The movement to incorporate the town of Madras is timely, for with construction work about to begin in this immediate vicinity on a large scale on both railroads, there promises to be need for some form of local government so that peace and order can be preserved in the community. In the old days before the railroads started work there was no urgent demand for the incorporation of the town, and one former attempt failed because of a lack of co operation on the part of some of the business men of the town, but the present movement is the result of a practically unanimous demand from all the residents and business interests for a local city government.

Madras is outgrowing its village days, and with two railroads building into it, the growth of the town will be more rapid from this time on. We want to aid that growth as much as possible along good healthy lines, and no other factor will contribute more to that result than a good local government. Not only will it enable us to provide those improvements which will be required as the town grows, but it will also enable us to make of it the kind of town which will attract people to it permanently as the natural home center of this entire section of country. There should be no opposition to incorporation from any one who has the good of the town at heart.

OUR DRY FARMING EXHIBIT

The Deschutes Valley, of which the Madras country is an important part and it may be said the best developed district at this time, got a good deal of fine advertising out of its exhibit at the Billings dry-farming congress. Much attention was attracted by the specimens of grain, fruit, vegetables and forage plants sent in from this section, and it doubtless opened the eyes of the many who saw them, as to the possibilities of this great region now being opened up by the building of two railroads. But from Mr. James J. Hill himself came one of the nicest compliments to the Deschutes Valley exhibit. Being scheduled for an address to the congress and arriving late, he explained his tardiness by saying: "I went to see the Deschutes Valley exhibit, and stayed longer than I intended." Mr. Hill is building the Oregon Trunk Line into the Deschutes Valley, and that exhibit probably convinced him that he was making no mistake.

The Deschutes Valley exhibit at Billings, Montana, came off victorious with the largest silver cup and a number of other prizes. The light of that great valley has been hid under a bushel for so long that it may be yet a few months longer before the rest of the world will become very familiar with the Deschutes Valley. Time and a railroad will work wonders, however, and within a few years the exhibits of fruit and agricultural products from the Deschutes Valley, as well as

from other localities in Central Oregon, will attract as much attention as those from older portions of the state. Some of the most fertile and best advertised valleys in the Pacific Northwest would still be uninhabited if they had not been favored with railroad transportation. The Deschutes has been slow in getting under way, but is coming fast, now that it has started.—Oregonian.
