IRRIGATION WILL COME

Great interest is taken by the people of this vicinity in the report of the parties who went to the head waters of the Deschutes a short time ago in the quest, of available waters to irrigate this section, and whose favorable report promises that water will be put upon our lands in the near future. With this prospect in yiew, and the well known and favorable results that are obtained by the application of water to the land in this section, every assistance should be given the parties who are promoting the project and who are endeavoring to secure the consent of the Department of the Interior to the use of Crescent and adjoining lakes as reservoirs in which to store waters for the irrigation of the territory North of Crooked River, of which this is a portion.

These parties are seeking to take up a project of great magnitude, but that they are capable of carrying it to successful completion is evidenced by their work in different portions of Idaho, where they have completed several projects that are now veritable garden spots of produc-

What these gentlemen need now is principally moral support in presenting a petition to the Government showing that the people of this section are practically unanimous in wanting this territory included in a project under the Carey Act. Every Citizen North of Crooked River should make it a point to see that his name is on the pe tition.

"KNOW YOUR OWN STATE"

Dry farming for arid Oregon and irrigation for humid Oregon is the paradoxical slogan of the Oregon Conservation Commission appointed last June by Governor Benson. This body is undertaking a study of the state's natural resources, the extent of their present use and methods of increasing their use along approved lines, having constantly in mind co-operation with Na tional and other state organizations of like purpose. To begin with, the Commission has launched what may be called a "Know-your-own-state" campaign. Cash prizes are offered to university and high school students for the best papers on conservation topics, namely: Forests of Oregon, irrigation institutions, soils, dry-land farming, roads and fish. Details of the offer are published in another page of the Oregonian today. Co-operation of schools and colleges throughout the state is urged. No doubt there mil-dv will be prompt and zealous response.
