According to Mr. Buchard the Boise & Western will build from Ontario in a northwesterly direction, through Malheur canyon to a point directly east of Malheur lake. From that point two surveys have been made for a continuation of the line.

One of the projected lines passes to the north of Malheur lake and the other between Malheur lake and Harney lake. The objective point of the road will be attained through the use of either line. Bend will in all probability be the junction point for the new line with the creeping toward the heart of Oregon


