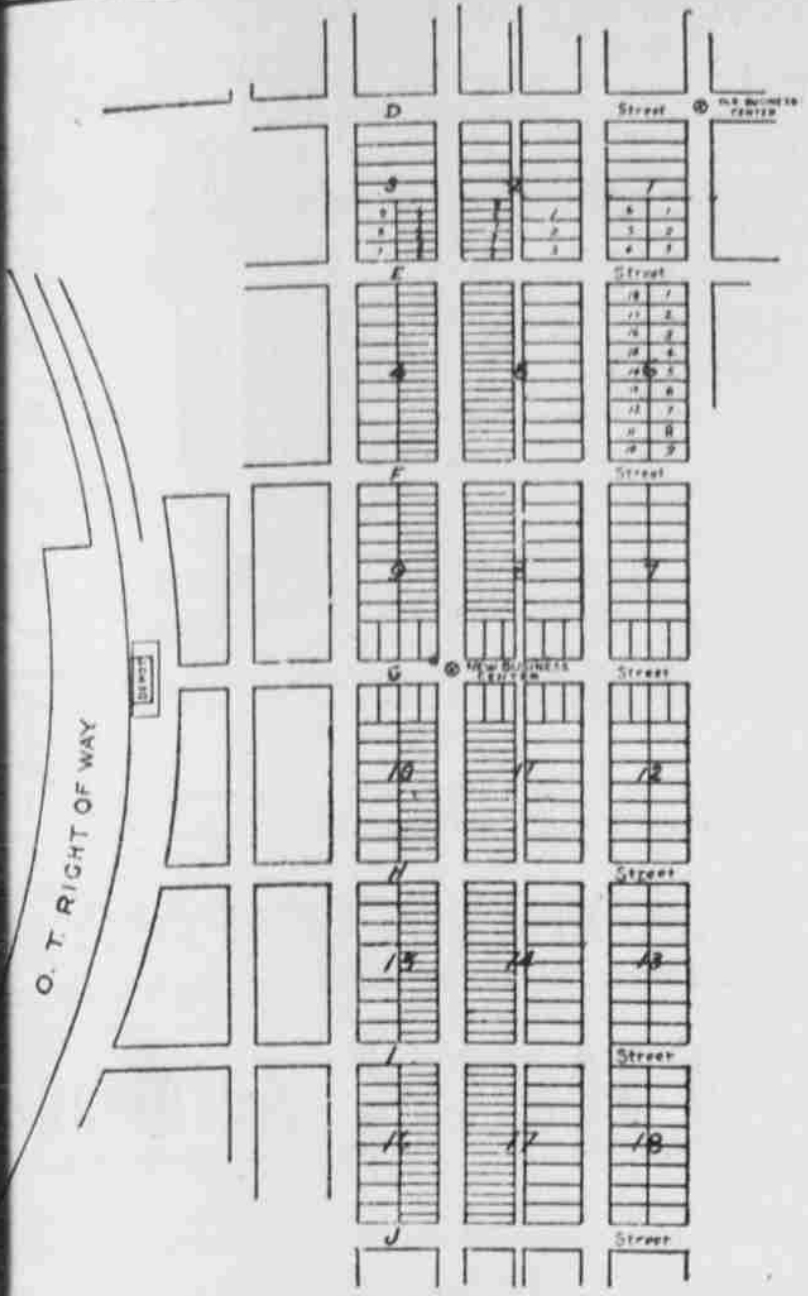


DEPOT ADDITION TO MADRAS, OREGON

Writer Tells About Tributary Country

OF BIG WHEAT BELT

Depot for Marketing Pro- ducts from 800,000 Acres of Rich Land

Calvert, staff correspondent of the Oregonian, who accompanied the Hill party on a trip through the interior of the following facts in his immediate section in his articles appearing in the Oregonian:

General activity and extends over an area of approximately 50 miles square in Madras on the north, Bend on the south and taking in both the Deschutes River on the east and West. Through- out the district a large variety of conditions are encountered. This is the center of what is the wheat country of the Oregon Valley and, for the time being, at least, will be the grain shipping point. It draws from the Agency on the North and West and from the Lamonta, Haystack and Opal districts on the East and South. Its territory will extend about Creek on the North and about the River on the South. The Agency Plains, lying between Madras, comprise a tract of about 15 miles long and three miles wide. Little of the district embraced in the Agency Plains will produce wheat and which will be shipped to Madras. Between Haystack and Trout Creek, located on the Blizard Ridge as yet almost uncultivated. This tract of 75,000 acres probably show greater per acre of wheat than the Agency Plains, as it has a

greater rainfall. The Lamonta, Culver, Haystack and Opal Prairie districts stretching away to the East and South are well settled and are producing grain, hardy vegetables and alfalfa.
