The yield per acre has been from 3 to 31/2 tons. For the past five years I have cultivated heavily in the spring with a disc harrow, under which treatment the stand is improving. I have no doubt but that the same may be profitably grown as a seed crop if planted in drill rows and cultivated. Yours very truly, G. SPRINGER.
