HOOKED RIVER POWER PLANT
 Prineville Men to harness Stream

THE COVE ORCHARD
 British Electricity For Madras
 Also Power For Prineville
 Flouring Mills

Booth, D. F. Stewart, G. M. and County Clerk Warren Brown will have incorporated a company for the purpose of developing a lower Crooked River, the site of a power plant selected being just above the Cove Orchard property. It is understood that this company has ultimately put a dam across the river and develop 4000 horsepower, the immediate present they will dig a ditch and develop hydroelectric power for transmission to Prineville, and other points desiring it. It is realizing that the investment in the project will prove a profitable one. The demand for power has become great with Mr. Stewart, who owns Prineville Flouring Mills, and the power to which power from the new mill will be put will be to operate the Prineville mill. The mill people have been forced to install steam power in the past month on account of the Crooked River being almost dry at Prineville, neither supplying power as for the mill, nor for irrigating the alfalfa farms along the river below and above the county seat. The membership of the water is now in court for settlement, and in the meantime the water at Prineville will be valuable for irrigation than for the power. Hence the move of Prineville to appropriate power from the river. The benefit of those who are situated with Crooked River throughout the entire course, conditions need explanation. This river in the neighborhood of Prineville and from a point a mile or two below crossing in the summer time is a low little creek. However, down the gorge below Trail Crossing the springs of pure ice cold water pour out from beneath the towering rocks and flow into the river channels. Among the most noted of these is the famous Opal Springs, the waters of which thousands of year-olds can be taken as they flow from the depths of the spring. Any of these clear springs flow in the river along the gorge that by the time the Cove is reached Crooked is a great stream of potential energy, hemmed in on each side by solid walls affording the finest opportunity for the development of power, coming with big trout for which the valley is famous.

grade. The depot grounds just reach the west edge of Madison street, which leaves a full open street on the east side of the depot.
 All of the road crossings in the vicinity of the depot are to be placed just as conveniently as possible to facilitate access to the warehouses for wagons delivering or receiving freight, as well as to leave all public highways unobstructed.
 Going on to the grounds, one cannot fail to be struck with the slightly location of the Madras depot. The Oregon Trunk will build its station at the very closest point to the present business portion of the town that it could, the first point reached where the track is on natural grade, and which can be made a suitable station without an enormous expense of grading or filling. The station buildings will be the finest on the line, and every promise that the Hill road has made to Madras is being kept to the letter.
