In 1878 they came to Oregon and resided in Linn county about two year before coming to this country. He removed with his wife to Crook county in 1904, and on account of his sickness returned to Sheridan two years ago, a large portion of which time he has been helpless from paralysis. Besides his wife, five children survive him, five sons and two daughter, of these W. E. M. M. and C. E. Mendenhall reside here, J. W. and J. R. Mendenhall in Crook county, Mrs. A. J. Bewley in Calgary, Canada and Mrs. C. C. Lamson, at Toppensish, Wash. A brother and sister also survive him; J. R. Mendenhall and Mrs. Mary J. Bible, of Sheridan.
