headquarters at Cleveland, former general manager of the O.

R. & N. community booklets which the people of Oreson issue seem to be exactly the right thing to obtain the desired results, and the right class of people for settlement along your line," he writes. He added that that line of publicity, with newspaper advertising, is bringing Oregon into favorable prominence throughout the East.

Ben Campbell, in charge of the traffic of the New York, New Haven & Hartford road, and former traffic manager of the O. R. & N., after making like comment, gives the information that the officials of that line are contemplating a similar campaign of publicity through the New England States.

The passenger department of the Grand Trunk Railway, with headquarters in Montreal, also wishes to keep supplied with exploitation literature. An official of the line writes that he has daily requests for Oregon literature and information. People there, he says, are desirous of securing land in Oregon and of settling in the larger cities and towns.

In addition to these the Pennsylvania system through J. W. Lee, Jr., has asked the oft-repeated question, "How is it done?" and implies that his line wants to do likewise.

Local railroad officials are assiting the Eastern roads in every way possible to spread Oregon advertising through that portion of the country. They are glad that the results of their persistent campaign have been noticeable there.

Another line of community publicity that has made Oregon known throughout the East is the practice of sending display cars of state products over the Eastern roads. These Western lines now operate cars of that kind. It is probable, however, that that feature of advertising will be discontinued after a few more years, as the movement of display cars is said to entail considerable difficulty.

The permanent display rooms established by the Great Northern and other Western roads in many of the large Eastern cities are likely to replace the traveling exhibit. By constantly renewing these displays with fresh fruit and vegetables, the development of the state is pictured to the Eastern admirers vividly.

This practice, too, has brougt forth many inquiries from officers of civic bodies in other parts of the country who contemplate adopting similar methods.

# **DEMOCRATS MAKE GREAT GAINS IN EAST**

Dix Defeats Stimson in New York---Ohio and Indiana Democratic.

New York-Elections throughout the country Tuesday resulted in a political convulsion of far-reaching extent, similar at many points to the famous wave of 1892, and apparently more widespread in its effect.

In New York, John A. Dix, democratic candidate for governor, is elected over Henry L. Stimson, republican, by about 55,000, reversing the republican plurality of 70,000 in 1908 for Governor Hughes.

#### New Jersey is Democratic.

In New Jersey, Woodrow Wilson, democratic candidate for governor, is elected over Vivian M. Lewis, republican, by about 15,000, reversing the previous republican plurality of 8,000 for governor.

Governor Draper's former plurality

In Connecticut Judge Baldwin, democrat, is elected over Charles A. Goodwin, republican, by about 4,000, reversing the previous republican plurality of 16,000.

In Ohio, Governor Judson Harmon, democrat, candidate for re-election, appears to have carried the state by about 15,000, over Warren G. Harding, republican.

In New Hampshire, Robert P. Bass, republican candidate for governor, is leading C. E. Carr, democrat, by about 6,000.
