The Best Field For Colonization

Says President Louis W. Hill, of the Great Northern: "Oregon presents a better field for colonization than any other state today, not alone because of the lack of development of a large Many Disappointments Resulting From portion of it, but also because of the fact that almost any variety of climate that may be found from Maine to Mason and Dixon's line, or between the Atlantic coast and the Mississippi River, may be found in Oregon." Mr. Hill and the great financial interests he represents are backing their judgment regarding this state by investing more millions in this field than have ever been spent here in a similar period. The North Bank Road, across the Columbia River, was built almost exclusively for the purpose of developing the great trade of the Willamette Valley, Central Oregon and the coast regions of the state. The construction of that road was followed by the absorption of the Astoria & Columbia Railroad, the Oregon Electric and United Railways systems and the building of a road into the long-neglected Central Oregon country and to the Pacific Coast by way of Tillamook and Nehalem.

The possibilities of the region now being invaded by the Hill lines are so great, however, that it is hardly possible that the present aversion to rallroad invetsments will extend far enough to retard construction of the necessary feeders in Oregon and Washington for a period of great length.

In view of the unsettled financial condition in the East and the hostile sentiment that is preventing investment in railroad securities, it is somewhat surprising that the work on both the Hill and the Harriman systems in this state is progressing as rapidly as it is. The combined mileage of new

track which will be laid by these lines in 1910 will exceed that of any previous year of railroad building in the history of the state. In order to get this new territory which is being opened up into traffic-producing condition the railroads are making strenous efforts to induce immigrants to come to Oregon. Publicity work now carried on in the East is the most effective that has ever been undertaken.
