Railroad & Navigation Company

Ownership of the North Coast Railroad was formerly acknowledged and provisions for consolidation of the Oregon Railroad & Navigation Company, 10 of its subsidiary companies and the North Coast was made, in articles of incorporation filed resterday by Harriman officials of a great new holding company to be known as the Oregon-Washington Railroad & Navigation Com-

The incorporators are R. B. Miller, traffic manager of the Harriman lines in the Northwest: M. J. Buckley, vice president of the O. R. & N. in charge of operation and R. Koehler. The capital stock is placed at \$50. 000,000.

"The North Coast Railroad Company owns a line nearly completed from Atalia, near Wallula. Washington, to North Yakima, Washington. and has acquired terminals in Spokane and partially constructed some of the other lines mentioned in the articles as owned by it.

"The Oregon Eastern Railway Company is a company organized some years ago for the purpose of constructing lines in Central Oregon, This company has made surveys and acquired rights-of-way from Vale to Odell, Odell to Natron on the Southern Pacific, and from Bend to the California-Oregon state

"The company about to be organized, as shown by the articles proposes to take over that part of the line of the Eastenn Oregon covering the territory from Vale to Odell and from Bend to the California-Oregon state line. The Oregon Eastern will for the present continue to construct the line across the Cascade Mountains from Natron to Klamath.

It is reported that Kennedy made a confession to some of his friends and implicated two other pany, which is included in the men, who have been apprehended and their hearings have been held, in consequence of which they have been bound over to the next grand jury.

> It was known that Kennedy was in Madras by the authorities at Redmond and Prineville, who telephoned to Marshal Loveland Sunday evening to take him out of quarintine and send him to Redmond for a hearing, but this request was refused as he had not taken the proper steps to be let out, and the Madras officials did not care to take this responsibility. However under instructions from the County Health Board and Sheriff Elkins, Deputy Sheriff Robinson was instructed to take him to Redmond as soon as possible after having anti-toxin was administered and proper fumigation.
