The Madras city election passed off very quietly Tuesday, there being only one ticket put in nomination and no rivalry for office, except G. V. Stanton, who ran as an independent for councilman, winning out by 9 votes over W. R. Cook, the citizen's nominee. The vote received by the various candidates is as follows:

H. W. Turner, mayor, 94 votes; J. H. Jackson, recorder, 89; D. W. Barnett, treasurer, 94; F. M. Loveland, marshal, 85; W. R. Cook, councilman, 51; A. W. Culp, councilman, 86; S. E. Gray, councilman 90; J. C. Robinson, councilman, 89; C. E. Roush, councilman, 89; G. V. Stanton, councilman, 60; T. B. Tucker, councilman, 90.

Lewis H. Irving, a young attorney, has decided to locate in Madras, and will have his office, for the present, with D. W. Barnett. There is plenty of business for two, and we wish him all kinds of success.

City Council Proceedings

The regular monthly meeting of the Madras city council was held Tuesday evening, Mayor Turner, Councilmen Gray, Tucker, W. R. Cook, W. H. Cook, T. A. Long and treasurer Barnett being present. Councilman Smith was absent.

Work of the council of special interest to the public follows:

Ordered by the council that all bids for the graveling of Fifth Street be rejected.

The street light to be placed on the hill near Larkin's residence will be purchased by the citizens and maintained by the city.

Ordered that the city levy a five mill tax. This motion was previously lost, but upon being reconsidered, was passed by the council. The ordinance providing for this levy appears in another column.

An ordinance providing for the licensing and regulation of saloons was passed. A portion of this ordinance appears in another column. The license for saloons is fixed at \$1000, payable semi-annually.
