**ORDINANCE No. 16**

An Ordinance entitled An Ordinance providing for licensing and regulating wholesale liquor dealing.

Be it ordained by the Common Council of the City of Madras:

Section 1. That any person, corporation or company, wishing to engage in the selling of spiritous, malt and vinous liquors and hard cider, at wholesale, in the corporate limits of the city of Madras, must first obtain a license from the City Council of the city of Madras as herein provided, which license when so obtained shall entitle him or them to engage in the business of selling spiritous, malt and vinous liquors and hard cider at wholesale, in quantities not less than five gallons, of any one article.

Section 2. All licenses obtained under the provisions of this ordinance shall be paid Semi-annually, and commence as near as practicable on the 1st day of January and 1st day of July of each year, provided, however, that the City Council, may at its discretion issue a license for the unexpired time of either half of the year by the applicant paying a pro rata amount of sum or money for a license as fixed in this ordinance.

Section 3. No person, firm or corporation having obtained a license to sell spiritous, malt or vinous liquors and hard cider, at wholesale, as stated above, shall be allowed to sell spiritous, malt and vinous liquors and hard cider, at retail, without having first obtained a license from the Council of the City of Madras to do so.

Section 4. That any person, firm or corporation or company wishing to engage in the business of selling spiritous, malt and vinous liquors and hard cider at wholesale, within the corporate limits of the city of Madras, must first pay to the city treasurer of the City of Madras the sum of \$250.00; which sum when so paid shall entitle him or them to a license for the time specified in such application, provided, however, that the council, at its own discretion, may reject any and all application for a license to sell spiritous, malt and vinous liquors and hard cider, at wholesale or retail.

Section 5. That any person, corporation or company violating any of the provisions of this ordinance, shall be guilty of a misdemeanor, and upon conviction thereof before the recorder's court, shall be punished by a fine of not less than \$5.00 Dollars nor more than \$50.00 Dollars, or be confined in the City jail one day for each two dollars of such fine as may be adjudged against them.
