ORDINANCE No. 16

An Ordinance entitled An Ordinance p oviding for licencing and regulating wholesate liquor dealing.

Be it ordained by the Common Council of the City of Madras:

Section 1. That any person, corporation or company, wishing to engage in the selling of spiritons, malt and vinous liquors and hard cider, at wholesate, in the corporate limits of the city of Madras, must first obtain a license. of Madras, must first obtain a license from the City Council of the city of Madras as herein provided, which license when so obtained shall entitle him or them to engage in the business of selling spiritous, malt and vinous liquors and hard cider at wholesale, in quantities not less than five gallons, of any one article.

Section 2 All licences obtained under the provisions of this ord nance shall be paid Semi-annually, and commence as near as practicable on the 1st day of January and 1st day of July of each year, provided, however, that the DRA VAN TASSEL City Council, may at its discretion is sue a license for the unexpired time of either half of the year by the applicant paying a pro rata amount of sum of money for a license as fixed in this or-

Section 3. No person, firm or cor-poration having obtained a license to sell spiritous, malt or vinous ilquors and hard cider, at wholesale, as stated above, shall be allowed to sell spirit ous, malt and vinous liquors and hard cider, at retail, without regions and hard cider, at retail. cider, at retail, without naving first obtained a license from the Council of the City of Madras to do so.

Section 4. That any person, firm or orporation or company wishing to enmalt and vinous I quors and hard cider at wholesale, within the corporate limits of the city of Madras, must first pay to the city treasurer of the City of Madras the snm of \$25000; which sum when so paid shall entitle him or them to a license for the time specified in such application, provided, however, that the council, at its own discretion, may reject any and a'l applications for a li-cense to sell spiritous, malt and vinous liquors and hard cider, at wholesale or retail.

Section 5. That any person, corporation or company violating any of the provisions of this ordinance, shall be guilty of a misdemeanor, and upon conviction therefore before the recorder's court, shall be punished by a fine of not less than \$5 00 Dollars nor not D. W. BARNETT more than \$50.00 Dollars, or be confined in the City jail one day for each two dollars of such fine as may be ad-
