### Harriman Road Up Deschutes

From the anniversary number of the Oregonian.

Seventy miles of track have been laid on the new grade of the Oregon-Washington Railroad & Navigation Company, leading up the Deschutes canyon into Central Oregon. Within a few weeks the road will be completed to the town of Madras and trains placed in operation.

The Deschutes branch leaves the main line of the Oregon-Washington Railroad & Navigation Company at a point near the confluence of the Deschutes River with the Columbia. This point is about 110 miles east of Portland.

The Deschutes line of the Harriman system is one of two roads that have chosen the Deschutes canyon as a means of access to Central Oregon and for a distance of 70 miles the roads parallel each other—one on one side and one on the other side of the gorge. At times the grades are but 300 feet apart and at one point the rival road, the Oregon Trunk line, crosses the river, tunnels through a high rock cliff by the side of the O. W. R. & N. road and then crosses back to the west side of the river.

Completion of the Harriman road to Madras is temporarily delayed at the present end of the rails. For many weeks the two roads contested in court and otherwise for right of way advantages at what is known as the Smith ranch, a place opposite the Warm Springs Indian Reservation. Both roads desired to locate their grades in the same place. An adjustment was finally made, by the terms of which the Oregon Trunk line is to construct 12 miles of railroad on what has been the disputed territory and the Harriman road is to have trackage right over it. The conflict, however, delayed the commencement of construction so long on the 12 miles of grade at a tunnel that is required in that section of the work that this 12 miles represents practically the only uncompleted section between the Columbia River and Madras.

At the southern end of the 12 miles of joint track the Harriman road turns up Trout Creek and makes its way up Sage Creek and other draws, reaching the plains of Central Oregon a few

miles north of Madras. The railroad keeps on the edge of Willow Creek basin, in which the town of Madras is located, and thereby keeps about 200 feet above the present business portion of the town.

When you arrange your eastern trip be sure to include the Sunset Route through New Orleans, El Paso, Los Angeles and San Francisco for return. It is a splendid educational journey, and at this time of the year especially delightful because so warm and comfortable. Every mile is through the sunny southland—the rice and cotton fields of Louisiana and Texas, the vast mirage mesas of New Mexico and Arizona, now spread with bright green, the orange groves and semi-tropic charm of California, miles and miles along the ocean shore, and several of the most interesting cities on the continent.
