#### First Encounter Results in Nothing But Harmless Exhibition.

El Paso, Feb. 8 .- The first battle of Juarez between federal troops and insurrectionists was exhibited word, for no one was hurt on either Reciprocity Bill Must Par by a thousand or more El Pasoans. who lined the bank of the Rio Grande on the American side, about three miles west of this city.

The exchange of missiles occupied about 15 minutes, during which about 200 shots were fired. According to Pascual Orozco, leader of the Insurrectos, his men fired only of these. He declared that the fed-

erals got away so fast that they were out of range before more could be fired at them. Tonight the federals are behind


