and hotel also will be established at Fallbridge, Wash., which will be the North Bank connection for the Oregon Trunk service until the Columbia River bridge is completed.

The tracklaying and surfacing crew have been working in and about Metolius and Madras for the past few days in the effort to get the road in good condition for the inauguration of regular service. As all the grading south of that point to Bend has been completed the rails will be laid with a rush and the operation of trains into Bend by the middle of August is possible.

KURIOS FROM KORRESPONDENTS
Q. My hens are splendid layers, but they will molt late, and thus I miss some of the early winter eggs. How may I arrange my feeding so I get less cheap eggs and more high priced winter eggs?

A. As molting season approaches cut down the ration, omit from it as much as possible egg forming ingredients, feed feather former and keep down lice. Then when feathers are falling fast feed a good strong ration and plenty of it.

Q. Which pigeons do you consider best for market squabs—the Runt, Dragon, Duchess or Homer?

A. Homer. Runts give a pound and a half squab, but only two or three pairs per year, Dragons take a week longer to mature, and the Duchess has the unpopular feather leg. Good Homers raise from seven to eight pairs of the quality and size squab in demand per annum.

Q. When in her lifetime does a hen reach the point that she does not pay?

A. When she doesn't pay for her feed, just pays for it or when the profit from her product is not a good rate on the investment. We have had hens lay as well as pullets when in their fifth year, but the limit of usefulness is from two to two and a half. Show birds are different. Some roosters are seen at county fairs ten years in succession and if a rare breed keep winning till the last inning.
