

# W Schedule Oregon Trunk

On Monday last, the schedule of the Oregon railway went into effect, Madras a much more convenient train time than under the old schedule, and cutting the time of the trip from Fallbridge an hour and ten minutes on the South bound and an even hour on the train.

Under the revised schedule, No. 101, going north, is here at 8:50 a. m., rather than 7:50, as under the old schedule, formerly due at 7:15 p. m. is now due at 7:15 a. m. a difference of an hour or more is made at this end of the line as the trains arrive and leave at the same time as formerly, passengers on No. 101

It is probable that when the road has been ballasted, and the schedule is further extended to Redmond and Bend, the time will cut still further in the putting of passengers into Madras shortly after six in the evening, and at Bend at 8 o'clock.
