DIPHTHERIA AGAIN

Two cases of diphtheria have developed the early part of the week, one of which proved fatal and the other is on the road to recovery, as far as that disease is concerned.

The child that died was

the six year old daughter of J. D. White, who resides in the eastern part of town. The child has been afflicted with throat trouble for several months past, having taken treatment from a physician on several occasions during this time; and at the time this disease set in medical atten-

tion was not called until the case was well developed, when anti-toxine was administered, but the ravages of the disease could not be counteracted, and the child passed away Monday morning.

The other case is that of the young son of H. K. Nisson, and as anti-toxine was taken as a preventative in time, the case has been kept under control,

and it is thought no serious results will come of it, as reported by Dr. Long who has charge of this case.

The families have been placed under strict quarantine and the school has been closed for the remainder of the week to allow a thorough fumigation of the building to prevent further development of the disease.
