Mail to Come by Rail After April 10

Will Give Central Oregon Her Mail Twentyfour Hours Earlier

The railway mail service over the Oregon Trunk railway for Central Oregon will be inaugurated on April 10. A contract was entered into between the government and the railroad the latter part of last week which will continue in effect for a year.

This arrangement provides for the carrying of all the mail for the stations along the line as well as that for Pineville, Redmond and Bend and all of the small postoffices in the interior.

of mail for Crook county at least 24 hours, while in some cases the people will be able to get their mail 48 hours earlier than has been the custom under the old stage route from Shaniko.

While express matter was handled over the new railway commencing with the second day that trains were operated, the change in the routing of the mail had to go through the customary channel of red tape, making it about 30 days later in getting under the changed system.

To be able to receive their mail regularly every day and the improvement that will be hailed with great satisfaction by the businessmen of Central Oregon and every individual as well. The fact that freight and express can now be received promptly, avoiding the long and tedious delays that has been experienced in the past, has given a great impetus to business and the people of the interior are beginning to realize that at last after all these years of waiting the isolation of this district is passing away forever.

Doubtless this means so much to the old timers in Crook county that the new settlers here will scarcely be able to appreciate the new order of things in the same light as do those who have lived here under the old regime.

The official order received by Postmaster Davis from the office of the second assistant postmaster general is as follows:

WASHINGTON, MAR. 28. Sir: Railroad mail service is authorized by the Postmaster general on route No. 173042, from Fallbridge, Wash., by intermediate postoffices, to Metolius, Oregon, from April 10, 1911, by the Oregon Trunk railway. The department will provide for the receipt and delivery of the mails at your office.
