New Grade Completed

S. P. Luelling who has a ranch on the north end of Agency Plain was in the city yesterday and states that the wagon grade which has been under construction by the Oregon Trunk railway from Mecca to the Plain is about completed. With a length of about three miles the heaviest grade is said to be not to exceed 7 per cent while the greater portion is about 3 or 4 per cent. The road is twelve feet wide, with extra wide places for teams to pass on every point where there is a turn. Much of the road has been blasted out of solid rock and the expense of building it has been large. The road will be opened for public use during the coming week and will hereafter be the route traveled from Madras to Warm Springs Agency. It will also give the north end farmers access to the station at Mecca and provide a shorter haul for water to their ranches. The road reaches the level of the plain on Mr. Luelling's ranch.
