Personal and Local NORTH BEACH

I. H. Shutt and family and Ed Brown have gone to the Cascade Mountains on a hunting and fishing trip.

H. E. Scull, local manager for the Madras Lumber company, has bought lots in the Lockard and Snook addition and will build a residence on the property. The lots are located near the Guss Loveland home.

Sam B. Story, special agent and adjuster for the Lancashire & London Fire Insurance company, who has his headquarters in Portland, was in the city Tuesday and Wednesday looking after business.

Work is being held up in the drilling of the big well for the Deschutes Railway near town on account of a string of tools being stuck in the hole at a depth of about 290 feet. The formation through which the drill is sinking has been found to be full of crevices which have caused drillers considerable trouble all over Crook county. The drillers have ordered fishing tools to get the well cleared for further drilling.

Patrons of John Campbell's meat market are noting a decided improvement in the condition of the meats supplied by that market since the adoption of the cold storage plan employed. The beeves after being slaughtered are taken to the cold room of the Central Oregon Ice & Cold Storage company from which depot the quarters are taken to the shop as needed. The shop is also equipped with refrigerators so that the meats are practically kept on ice from the time they are killed until delivered to the consumer.

Regarding the disappearance of Max Wilson, the Pioneer seems to have been in error in the article printed in the issue of June 8th, with reference to the dividing of the money by Mr. and Mrs. Wilson, at the Warm Springs Ferry, the afternoon of his disappearance. Mrs. Wilson states that nothing was said about dividing the money, which they had taken with them from the store, and also with reference to Mr. Wilson's disappearance several years since, when Mr. Wilson was in the middle west looking for employment. Mrs. Wilson states that on this occasion she failed to receive several letters that he had written her, which was the foundation of the report that he had deserted her at that time.

The body of John E. York was found recently in Rogue river, near Grants Pass, wrapped in a heavy logchain which had been used for a sinker. A man named Holly Wilkes was arrested, charged with the murder and later made a confession of the crime. He said that he went to York's camp and that a quarrel resulted, during which he hit York a blow on the head with a club, and then threw him in the river. York was well known here, having been engaged in the freighting business for several years. Since the murder Wilkes has sold one of York's teams and put another team in pasture, and it is believed that he murdered him with the intention of realizing from his property.
