Horsestealing Case Dismissed
 The case of State of Oregon vs. Charles Van Valkenberg and J. Hall, on charge of larceny of a horse, came to a hearing last evening in the justice court. At the hearing it was shown that Van Valkenberg was a partner with H. A. Brown, the complaining witness, in the ownership of the animal in question, and Deputy District Attorney Wirtz moved for a dismissal. Hall went along with Van Valkenberg to Springfield, where both were arrested, merely as a passenger, and the charge against him was also dismissed. Nobody hurt except the county treasury, which will later be mulcted to the extent of about \$200 in this case. —Prineville Journal.

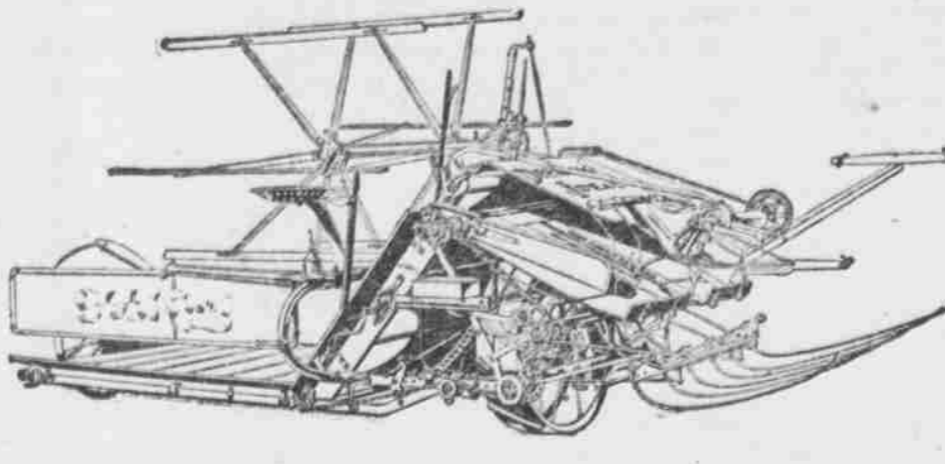
