NO APPROPRIATION FOR EXPERIMENT FARM

Report Printed in This and Other
County Papers Last Week
Was Mistake

The report printed in The Pioneer and several other county papers last week to the effect that an appropriation of \$1500 had been set aside for two experimental stations was an error. The following, taken from the court records, is what actually happened:

"Commissioner Rice maintains that Crook county has no authority to appropriate money for such purposes.

"Commissioner Bayley favors an appropriation of \$750 during 1911, and \$750 during 1912, for the establishment and maintenance of a dry farming station, but desires to take under advisement the question of the establishment of a station devoted to irrigation problems.

"Judge Ellis takes the stand that in view of the apparent universal demand and need of both stations for the proper and intelligent direction of settlers, present and prospective, the county is warranted in indicating its willingness to contribute the sum asked for in establishing both stations, including numerous sub-stations, provided \$7000 is contributed toward the same purpose from other sources."

FARMERS MAY WIN VALUABLE PRIZES

Land Show to be Held This Winter
Offers Cups Valued at \$1000
for Farm Products

The following news item from Portland, Ore., is sent out this week by promoters of the big land shows to be held in the east and middle west this winter:

"Farmers and stock raisers of the pacific Northwest have an opportunity to win a number of valuable prizes at the big land shows to be held in the east and middle west next winter. At New York City's first land show, to be held in Madison Square Garden, November 6 to 12, cups valued at \$1000 each will be offered for the best exhibits of single products. These include wheat, oats, potatoes, corn, barley, apples, sugar beets, hops, alfalfa, etc.

"The New York exposition will be the biggest land show ever held in America and the most valuable prizes ever offered for agricultural products will be awarded. Agriculture as it is generally practiced, dry farming and irrigation methods will be demonstrated. Moving pictures, lectures, literature and actual farmers will demonstrate the advantages of owning and developing land.

"The show will voice the cry of 'back to the soil.' It will show tillers of worn-out land how to rejuvenate their soils or where to seek richer farms; it will point the city man to green fields and will direct the immigrant. It is of special advantage for Oregon and Washington to be well represented at this big show and commercial bodies and the railroads are urging the fullest co-operation by Northwest producers. F. W. Graham, western immigration agent for the Great Northern Railway, Portland, will supply entry blanks to all who will exhibit and will give full information as to preparations for shipping. There is no entry fee required."
