A Silver Library. There is in the royal library of Koblenz a silver library consisting of a collection of twenty silver and copper, bound in pure silver and gilded with gold. The library has been in possession of this treasure since 1611. These books were made by Duke Albert, the first duke of Prussia in the latter half of the sixteenth century. It is supposed that they were made at Nuremberg, where Albert was duke for three years. Through the efforts of Ostander and afterward Lucretia, Duke Albert became a friend of the reformation. Copies of the silver library are made accessible to students taking bibliographic copies of the books.

Cut up in the "Universal" Food Chopper, using the medium cutter, two pounds of lean, fresh beef, boiled and cold; five pounds of apples, pared and cored; two pounds of seeded raisins, three-quarters of a pound of citron. With the fine cutter pulverize one pound of beef suet, one nutmeg, one tablespoonful of cloves and two of cinnamon. Add all together with one pound of sulfana raisins, two pounds of currants, two tablespoonfuls of rice, one of allspice, one of fine salt, two and one-half pounds of brown sugar, one quart of brown sherry and one pint of brandy. Mix all thoroughly together and stand in a cool place. It will last all winter. 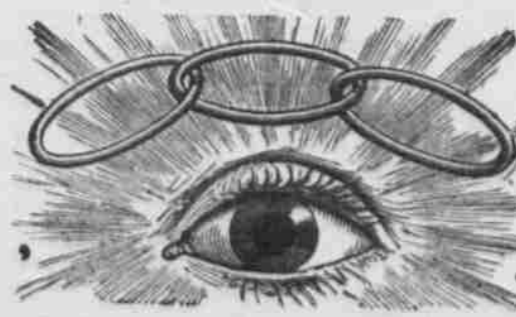
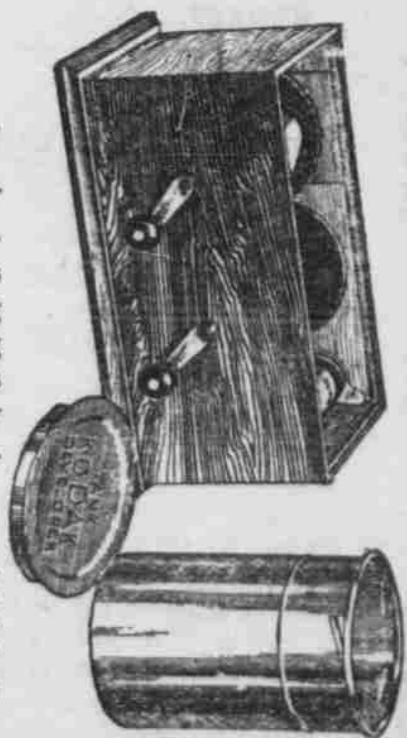
