Grade Seed Grain Early. Do not wait until spring to clean and grade your seed grain. Do it now, while you have plenty of grain at hand from which to select. The best twenty-five bushels of grain out of a hundred bushels are worth much more for seed than is the grain that can be cleaned from a much smaller amount in the spring. The cost of thus cleaning and grading the grain is very slight, and it enables one to have heavy, plump seed grain at very little outlay.—Exchange.

Fertilizer For Dahlias. Any good commercial fertilizer rich in ammonia and phosphoric acid and liberally supplied with potash will suit dahlias, but the best results are obtained by using it in connection with manure. Prepare the ground as you would for corn. When the plants are flowering freely a handful of top dressing to each plant and four parts bone-meal to one part nitrate of soda will be very helpful.—Rural New Yorker.
