is safe to predict now that Oregon Trunk and Central railroads have penetrated Deschutes country, that the breeders of good stock and especially those who breed registered stock will become better known to the outside world.

Springer has been breeding horses for the past thirty-

five years, gradually getting into the Belgain strain. During 1908 his horses sold for an average higher than those of any other breeder in the northwest, amounting to over \$400 each for the year's sales. While he has a few pure bred Belgians, most of his horses are high grade, big heavy drafters.

Mr. Spinger is also breeding registered Poland China hogs. He has good blood of the medium type, neither too coarse nor too fine boned, his prime object being to secure prolific hogs with good constitution. Mr. Springer will exhibit this fall at the Prineville fair.—Rural Spirit.
