## WAMA EXPOSITION TO OPEN PROMPTLY

on Big Fair Shows That All  
be Ready for Public in Feb-  
ruary 1915

San Francisco, May 7.—Allan  
Calk, comptroller of the 1915  
General Exposition has sub-  
mitted to President Moore a state-  
ment of receipts and disburse-  
ments from the commencement  
of business in November, 1909  
to March 30, 1912. In this state-  
ment he shows that the total  
amount of signed subscriptions  
to date, is \$6,065,790 and that  
the total cash received from  
subscriptions and other sources  
amounts to \$1,725,349.65. He  
states that the total dis-  
bursements of every nature and  
description amounts to \$949,-  
000, which includes \$430,999.-  
for expenditures for site  
preparations. He reports that there  
is an unexpended balance of  
\$4,042.63.

Buildings are being dismantled  
and removed from the exposi-  
tion site in preparation for the  
1915 exposition. Workmen are now  
actively engaged tearing down  
structures that were landmarks in  
the Harbor View district. These  
buildings will be replaced by ex-  
position palaces, that are being  
designed by the foremost archi-  
tects of this country. Homes  
valued at three  
thousand dollars are  
being moved to other sec-  
tions of the city and on the  
sites they occupied will arise  
imposing buildings that will  
be in the neighborhood of half  
million dollars each.  
The filling in of the overflow  
basin comprising 71 acres on the  
Harbor View site at the foot of  
Water street is progressing  
rapidly. The giant dredger  
"John McMullin" is pumping  
material from the bay fronting the  
exposition site, through pipes

half a mile in length. As soon  
as this property is filled, work  
of improving it for exposition  
purposes will be taken up and  
put through expeditiously. It  
will go on rapidly and President  
Moore and the directors of the  
exposition have given positive  
assurances that when the doors  
of the exposition open on Feb-  
ruary 20th, 1915 the world will  
see a complete exposition.

## MUST LIVE FIVE YEARS ON CLAIM

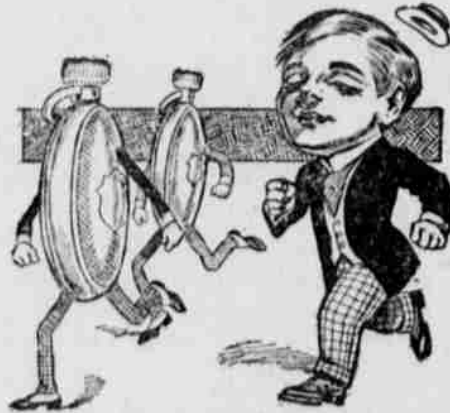
Constructive Residence Before Tak-  
ing Up Actual Home will Not be  
Counted

Instructions have been received  
by Howard W. Turner, United  
States Commissioner that in tak-  
ing five year final proofs of  
homestead entries, the entryman  
must show that he has resided  
on his claim five full years from  
the date of the establishment of  
his residence, and not five years  
from the date of its filing. En-  
trymen have been given six  
months in which to establish  
their residence, and under the  
practice as it has prevailed heretofore,  
this six months construc-  
tive residence as been counted  
as a part of the necessary five  
years, thus allowing the entry-  
man to make final proof after an  
actual residence of only four  
years and six months.

The instructions received were  
to the effect that all commis-  
sioners taking final five year  
proof, shall be governed strictly  
by this ruling.

The new three-year homestead  
bill, now before Congress, pro-  
vides that an entryman is allowed  
an absence of five months from  
his claim during each year, such  
absence to be allowed however  
only after actual residence has  
been established. Therefore if  
the bill should become a law, it  
would in no wise effect the rul-  
ing as to constructive residence.
