A SIMPLE, PRACTICAL WATER SYSTEM.

Our pictures tell the simple story how an inexpensive water system may be installed for household, poultry plant, the barn, greenhouse or truck patch.

The fellow who has such a convenience for poultry has a clutch, for carrying water by bucket or barrel is a job. The pump is a simple force pump, here run by gasoline engine, but it

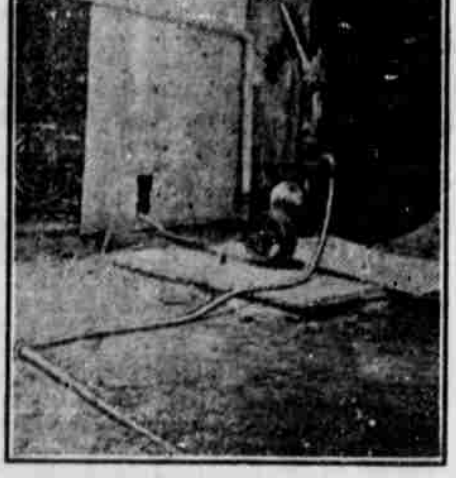

 may also be run by hand or windmill. Note connection to pipe.

The water may go direct from pump through to poultry yard or water trough, or it may be pumped into an outside or an inside tank and may be piped from there to place of use. In the poultry yards it may run through long troughs or be caught in

Individual vessels, the surplus being carried off by drains. This is especially a convenience where many ducks are raised, as they drink and "slop" much water. An artificial pond may thus be made for breeding ducks and a place where

market ducks may wash off before shipping. While it is a dirty falsehood that farmers never wash because they have no bathtub, it is also absurd to think that they cannot have all the conveniences when such a system affords them so easily.

ENORMOUS SUMS ARE SPENT BY HILL LINES

Improvements and Extension Work Bring Yearly Expenditure to \$8,000,000 Mark

Portland, Aug. 13—Improvements to the North Bank Road, the Oregon Trunk, the Oregon Electric, the Hill lines in Oregon and Washington is shown in the report of the expenditures of the company for the fiscal year ending June 30 for extension and betterments. During the last twelve months this amount has reached the enormous figures of \$8,000,000, and since January 1, more than \$4,000,000 has been expended.

Prominent in the improvements for the year ending June 30th have been betterments to the North Bank Road between Portland and Spokane and the extension of the Oregon Electric from Salem to Albany and Eugene. Service was inaugurated to Albany July 4. The line will be opened to Eugene this fall. The expenditures cover the North Bank Road, the branch to Astoria and the Oregon sea-coast, Oregon Trunk Railroad, Dalles, Portland & Astoria Navigation Company and the Spokane & Inland Empire system. The Salem-Eugene extension will cost \$3,000,000 making a total investment from Portland to Eugene of approximately \$4,500,000 when the Eugene service starts. This will give the Willamette valley electric transportation for people and products covering a great territory. On the North Bank Road many trestles are being filled, the curvature of the track in one instance being reduced to meet the established three degree curvature of the line for its entire length and other improvements and betterments. On the Spokane & Inland Empire system more than \$250,000 has been expended since January 1 in betterments and improvements.

The work now in progress on the Hill lines in Oregon is in keeping with the policy of the company to provide and maintain the most modern railroad possible. This means new extensions, more equipment, and betterments of every kind to meet the increase in traffic and keep the Hill roads in Oregon and Washington in line with the rapid progress of the country which they now serve. Albany's new station will cost more than \$15,000 and the one at Eugene \$20,000.
