BIG CAPITALIST WILL ENCOURAGE GOOD FARMING

Martin Winch and Associates Will Conduct Model Farm Near City of Portland in Near Future

Martin Winch, a well known Portland capitalist, proposes to do his part in encouraging good farming in this state and benefiting the agriculturist. He and a few associates will conduct a model farm near Portland, principally for purposes of demonstration. The object lesson farm will be managed according to the best and latest methods without thought of making anything more than running expenses. It will be a show place, calculated to give instruction to farmers.

The co-operation of Luther Burbank, the plant wizard, has been secured, and the fullest encouragement from the Oregon Agricultural College is expected. It will supplement the work of that institution. The farm will demonstrate farming in all its branches, including agriculture, horticulture, dairying, livestock breeding and even floriculture

"Women Rights."

There are over 100,000 women in Oregon. The majority of them do not want to vote. A small proportion in any given community is asking for the ballot. Is that not true in your town? What do the rest want?

Many of them are actively opposed. To put upon these women a responsibility from which they have been hitherto exempted and which they do not wish to assume is not "Woman's Rights."

Many of them are indifferent. The indifferent male voter is not of the serious problems of the present electorate. Would you add to it a large body of votes avowedly indifferent?

The demand for woman suffrage is the demand that woman shall assume an equal share with men in the responsibility of carrying the government of the city, the state, the nation. It means that she shall enter with him the political arena. For it is an arena. Politics is not a conflict of opinions, it is a conflict of wills. It carries with it public meetings, public debates, public marchings and counter-marchings, public discussions of public questions, and of the character of public candidates, and all the other incidents of a campaign.

It is not democratic nor just, nor fair to draft this large body of women into this campaign against their wills.

This is the sixth time the voters of Oregon have been asked to vote upon this question in spite of the fact that every two years the opposition to it has increased so that in 1910 suffrage carried in only one county in Oregon, and in that one by five votes, the total vote being 35,270 for suffrage, the smallest vote for it since 1900, and 59,065 against, a majority of 23,795.

The Oregon State Association opposed to the Extension of the Suffrage to Women asks that you give this amendment your earnest consideration, and that you defeat it this time by so great a plurality that the suffragists, local and imported, must bow before the will of the people of Oregon, and acknowledge that the majority rules in America.
