ADDITIONAL COAL DISCOVETIES IN TILLAS MOOK. - Chas. Robinson, and Mr. Chatterton have discovered additional coal beds in Tilla mook county. Specimens taken out of a bank eight miles north east of the bay, of both bituminous and anthracitic yarieties were brought over on last Saturday by Mr. Squires mail contractor, which we had subjected to the ordinary tests, and which proved, as far as could be determined with the small quantity experimented with, equal in quality to the coal of like varieties found in the carbon iferous regions of the western States.
