A horrible tragedy occurrednear Oakland. For some time past a man named Saufly has resided with his wife and one child at Oakland Point Almeda County, and followed the business of raising and selling stock. I ast evening he and his wife went to a neighbor's house on wisit and left the child at home with a Chinese servant. About 11'clock they returned, found everything in the house apparently as they had left it, and retired. About 1 o'clock this morning four men entered the house, and attacked them while asleep, in their bed. The secondrels used a hatchet or other dull weapon, or a bloody murder would have been instantly accomplished. The blows were simed with savage fury at the heads and faces of the victims, inflicting hastly wounds, which may yet prove fatal. Mr. Saufly, after the first storm of blows, still retained sufficient consciousness to cry out for help which he did. The Chinaman then sprang out of bed and ran into city; so that, by the time the one hundred haste, leaving Mr Saufly unconscious, and s wife writhing in agony. The Chinaman did not run at ones to alarm the neighbors, but took such means as he could to staunch the wounds of Mr. and Mrs. Saufly. At four o'clock he left the house and called on the neighors for help.
