COMPILATION FROM THE HERALD.

New Orleans, Dec. 29.—There was another incendiary fire at Vicksburg last night. Loss, \$57,000. It is the third fire within a week.

A special order has been issued revoking Gen. Mower's order removing the Spec. of State and certain other offices. These removals are suspended by order of General Grant. Hancock's order says there is no evidence to sustain the allegations.

Memphis, Dec. 29.—Gen. Ord despatched an officer of the Freedmen's Bureau to Washington to represent to the Government the starved condition of freedmen in a large number of countries, and the absolute necessity of some provision by the Government to feed armed freedmen and prevent a war of races in such sections as are without food. Ord also instructed commanding officers to request leading colored men to give general notice that all freedmen who are able will be required to earn their own living during the coming year. They must go to work on the best terms that can be secured. Freedmen are using to work for a livelihood, when employment can be procured, must be punished as vagrants. Sheriffs and police officers are requested to co-operate in the enforcement of this order.

Montgomery, Ala., Dec. 22.—A dispatch says the Freedmen's Bureau officers who were trying to swindle the negroes of Alabama, have been turned and feathered. An entire negro family was recently murdered in Baldwin county.

From SAN FRANCISCO.—A grand demonstration occurred the evening of Dec. 21, in honor of the election of Cassier as U. S. Senator.
