

A NEW RELIGIOUS SECT.

A correspondent of the Boston Investigator writing from London says:

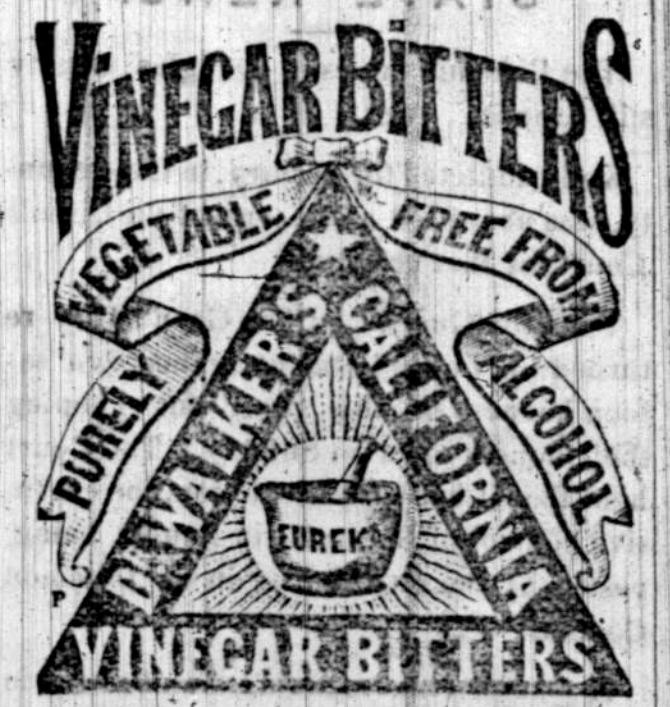
