Ceballos will issue a proclemation of the new condition of affairs, declaring that everything remains as higherto respecting Cuba's relation with Spain, and he, as well as other Spanish officials, will rejoice that a republican government is constituted in Spain. The most intense excitement exists among the people, although everything is tranquil.
