LOCAL AND DOMESTIC.

CELEBRATION AT ST. JOE.—Don't forget the celebration at this place to-day. A grand time is expected. Arrangements have been made to make this the best celebration that will be had in Oregon this year. The Oregon City Brass band has been engaged to entertain the visitors with the best of music; also a good string band will be there for the benefit of dancers. Among other amusements there will be a foot race between two of the fattest men in Yamhill county. We have been unable to learn their names, but we are informed that one weighs 250 pounds and the other 260 pounds. Turn out everybody.

A BRILLIANT FEAT.—The other morning Tom Huston started to Stanley's mill for a load of lumber. He drove up in front of Charley Easterbrook's shop to get his binding chain, left there the evening previous to be repaired, and finding the shop locked up, and being in a hurry to get out, the thought occurred to him that he could drive out a distance and return by time the shop would be open, and thus no time would be lost! THE SALE.—Judge Fenton sold, at public vendue on last Saturday, a lot of young stock, etc. Buyers were very numerous and the bidding spirited. The good quality of the stock sold justified the high figures at which it was bid off, although some animals brought what seemed to be an enormous figure. The flock of sheep, including lambs, brought \$2 75 per head; horses brought from \$150 down. A few two-year olds brought upwards of \$90 each, while one three-year old sold for \$105. The sale netted near \$2,000. H. H. Snow was the auctioneer, and is a good one.
