largest and choicest Southdown flocks in England, reccommends for sheep suffering with the scab, soft-soap, one and a quarter pounds; shag tobacco, one pound; spirits of turpentine, one pint; white arsenic three ounces. This to be safe and effectual must be boiled so as to thoroughly dissolve the arsenic, and that he regards as an important point. Better put the tobacco when boiled into a flannel bag, and squeeze it sufficiently to get out all the strength, in order to get the full benefit of it. Then add water enough to make four quarts of the wash for each sheep.

It is not a dip, but a wash, and to put it on, in old tea-pot or a spouted tin should be used. The way to make it most effectual is to open the wool by making three marks on each side of the sheep also one down the shoulder, one each side of the neck, one down the breast, and one down each thigh, and into the marks pour the liquid.
