Jan. 14, 1875, to provide for the resumption of specie payments the first of Jan. 1879, is fixed as the date when such resumption is to begin. It may not be destrable to fix an earlier date when it shall become obligatory upon the government to redeem its outstanding legal tender notes, in coin, on presentation; but it is certainly most desirable, and will prove most beneficial to every pecuniary interest of the country to hasten the day when the paper circulation of the country and gold-coin shall have equal values.
