

ROSEBURG APPROVES

Paper of That City Boosts For The Proposed New Electric Line.

MOST DIRECT ROUTE

It is Claimed and Passes Through a Fine Part of the State.

Roseburg people seem to approve of the proposed electric line from Roseburg to this place. The Spokesman of that place prints the following:

"From Roseburg to Coos Bay is the most direct and only feasible route over which to build a road. If some foreign capitalist cannot be interested why not local capital be induced to take the needed steps to build the road?"

"To do this it will be necessary to seek an alliance with the people of bay country.

"At the present time the people of the interior are in a measure at the mercy of the most gigantic corporations, the Southern Pacific Co. There is absolutely no means by which there can be or is a means of competition in the matter of transportation of freight or passengers. An electric road from this place to some point on the coast or at tide water near the coast would open up the means by which relief may be had. To this end we think one of the most appropriate things that the people of Roseburg can do would be to take steps looking to the forming of a coalescence with the citizens of Coos county and that they jointly construct and put into operation an electric road from Roseburg to some point on tide water or at its head.

"In the matter of supplies for Coos county all purchases could be made from the products of this county rather than California, as also all lumber manufactured in mills along the line would find a market or the gateway to a market through such

a road. In this and in many other ways such a road would be one of importance to that, as well as this country.

"This is a matter that should be taken up and it is hoped that some of the various Boards of Trade or commercial bodies in the territory most affected will take the initiative move in the matter."

CHANCE FOR THE SERVICE

Examinations for Interpreter Will Be Held in Oregon and Elsewhere.

The United States Civil Service Commission announces that an interpreter examination will be held May 15, 1907, at the places mentioned below to fill vacancies as they may occur in the position of interpreter in the immigration service, at \$1,200 per annum:

Examinations will be held in Boise and Moscow, Idaho; Astoria, Baker City, Eugene and Portland, Oregon; Bellingham, Port Townsend, Seattle, Spokane, Tacoma and Walla Walla, Washington.

Applications will be received for any of the following languages: Arabic, Armenian, Assyrian (Arabic), Bohemian, Bulgarian, Chinese, Croatian, Lalmation, Spanish, Dutch, Finnish, Flemish, French, German, Greek, Hebrew, Herzegovinian, Hindoo, Hungarian, Italian, Japanese, Lithuanian, Montenegrin, Magyar, Norwegian, Persian, Polish, Portuguese, Roumanian, Russian, Ruthenian, Servian, Slovak, Slovenian (Wendish), Slovenish (Kranish), Spanish, Swedish, Syrian, Syrian (Arabic), Turkish, Yiddish.

Age limit, 20 years or over on the date of examination.

Applicants should at once apply to the local secretary of the board of civil service examiners at any of the places mentioned above, or to the secretary, Twelfth Civil Service District, San Francisco, California, for application forms 304 and 1141, which should be properly executed and filed with the civil service commission, Washington, D. C.
