

# MRS. EDDY IS THE FOUNDER

Is Originator of American Branch of Association for International Conciliation

## WRITES A LETTER

Telling Her Position in Accepting the Designation Which is Tendered Her.

The following press telegram from New York tells of Mrs. Eddy's new work:

"With Mrs. Mary Baker G. Eddy as its American founder and Andrew Carnegie, Seth Low, Nicholas Murray Butler and other American publicists identified with the movement, an American branch of the Association of International Conciliation was organized today.

"The suggestion that Mrs. Eddy become the founder of the American branch was made at the close of the meeting in the First Church of Christ, Scientist, Boston, last week, when a meeting was held to interest members of that body in the proposed association.

"Baron de'Estournelles de Constant, member of the French senate, who is the founder and world president of the association, was present at today's meeting. He spoke at some length, saying that the purpose of the association is to fight for a perfect system of international arbitration.

"Andrew Carnegie and Andrew D. White are the honorary presidents of the association, Nicholas Murray Butler is president, Congressman Richard Bartholdt vice president and Robert H. Franks treasurer.

**Mrs. Eddy Accepts Designation.**  
"A letter which Mrs. Eddy wrote from Concord, N. H., to her church in Boston accepting her designation as founder was read at today's gathering. It was as follows:

"Your appointment of me as foundateur of the Association for International Conciliation is most gracious. To aid in this holy purpose is the leading impetus of my life.

Many years have I prayed and labored for the consummation of "On earth peace, good will toward men." May the fruits of your grand association, pregnant with peace, find their birthright in divine science.

"Right thoughts and deeds are the sovereign remedies of all earth's woe. Sin is its own enemy. Right is its recompense, even though it be betrayed. Wrong may be man's highest idea of right until his grasp in goodness grows stronger. It is always safe to be just.

"When pride, self and human reason reign, injustice is rampant. Individuals, as nations, unite harmoniously on the basis of justice, and this is accomplished when self is lost in love—in God's own plan of salvation.

### Man Must Follow God's Law.

"Human law is right only as it patterns the divine. Consolation and peace are based on the enlightened sense of God's government.

"Because of my rediscovery of Christian Science, and honest effort (however meager) to help human purpose and peoples, you may have accorded me more than is deserved, but 'tis sweet to be remembered."

"It was voted at today's meeting to name a committee of three, consisting of President Butler, Congressman Bartholdt and Hayne Davis, to prepare for the establishment of new branches of the association in each of the South American republics.

"Prof. William G. Shepard, professor of Spanish history in Columbia university, was deputized to take up this mission."
