

CATES NEAR MYRTLE POINT

any Capitalized at \$500,000
Secures Extensive Water
Rights On River.

ber of Commerce Takes Favor-
able Action on the Proposed
Electric Railroad.

(Times Special Service.)
Myrtle Point, May 8.—The Co-
quille Light and Power com-
pany incorporated in January, 1907,
with a capital of \$500,000, has se-
cured extensive water rights on the
fork of the Coquille river.
The company will hold a meeting
on Friday, May 6, at which it is ex-
pected to complete final details for
the prosecution of the project in
this section.
The company is not ready to
discuss its plans public, but it promises
to make one of the biggest things yet
undertaken in this section.

Chamber Meets.
Myrtle Point Chamber of Com-
merce and citizens met in the city
on the evening of May 1, where
they were addressed by Louis Bar-
zee, of Roseburg, on the proposed
building of an electric line from
Myrtle Point to deep water on Coos Bay.
Barzee's position was forcibly pre-
sented by Mr. Barzee.

Barzee made a number of brief and pointed speeches
and was followed by leading citizens. Great
interest is manifested regarding
the project. Dr. K. A. Leep was
present to accompany Mr. Barzee to
Myrtle Point and the other bay cities
to present the Myrtle Point Cham-
ber of Commerce and the interests of
this particular section of the coun-
ty.

The following preamble and res-
olutions were adopted:
Resolved, that the business men of
Myrtle Point have delegated Louis Bar-
zee to interview the people of Coos
county relative to the building of an
electric railroad from Roseburg to
Myrtle Point, and if possible, before
the next meeting, be it resolved, that we,

the people of Myrtle Point, being in
mass meeting assembled, most ear-
nestly express ourselves in favor of
building an electric road from Rose-
burg to deep water in Coos county,
by the way of Myrtle Point, and will
do all in our power to aid and assist
in the building of the same.
