Present Miss Frances McLeod, Court Stenographer With Letter of Thanks

JUDGE HEADS THE LIST

And Every Attorney of the Coos County Bar Affixes His Signature.

The following letter of thanks presented to Frances McLeod, who has just resigned her position as court stenographer of the circuit court of Coos county, is a high tribute to her faithful work in that capacity. The letter is signed by every lawyer and official attending the last session of the circuit court, with the single exception of Attorney Brown, who had left Coquille before the letter was presented.

Following is a copy of the letter and the names of those signing it:

Whereas, Frances McLeod is about to resign the position of court stenographer of the circuit court of the State of Oregon, in and for the County of Coos, which she has held for a period of six years last past.
