Tom Richardson struck the key note to successful publicity campalgating in both the speech delivered at Marshfield and North at Bend, when he stated that without "Last" there could be little excomplished in the building up of sities. The term carries more than usual significance on Coos Bay by reason of the peculiar strategetic relations of North Bend and Marshfield.

The cities are really individualized only in thought There cannot be two cities on this peninsula which gives every indication of becoming not only trans Pacific seaport but an ontlet and converging for this country whose resources tell their own story.

Coos Bay will ultimately be the site for one city. There will be no predomination of one over the other in the evolution Marshfield. North Bend and Empire will remain only as mementos of the time when Coos bay was in the marine.
