WILL SAVE ALPHA THIRSTY AT GARDINER

Vessel Which Was Beached Is Now Being Hauled Into Deep Water.

The schooner Alpha, which was beached some time ago near the mouth of the Siuslaw river, will be saved. The vessel is now being gradually hauled out to deep water. A San Francisco firm took the contract of refloating the vessel. A wench has been placed on her and an anchor sunk some distance to sea, and each high tide the vessel is worked farther out. A cable has been sent for from San Francisco, and when this arrives another anchor will be placed some distance past the breaker line, and it is thought by this method the vessel will be refloated. It will then be necessary to take it to a shipyard for repairs.

CHEESE SHIPMENT.

The Coos Bay Creamery has a large shipment of cheese in one of the local warehouses billed to the Klock Produce Company, of Seattle, Washington. The shipment consists of 60 boxes of two cheeses each.

THOMAS L. WAND DEPARTS.

The steamer Thomas L. Wand went to sea yesterday, bound for Everett, Washington, where she will load with poles for San Francisco.

TUG HUNTER ARRIVES.

The tug Hunter arrived yesterday from Gardiner with a cargo of butter, mohair and leather. She will return with a cargo of liquor and general merchandise.

Tug Hunter Takes Back Forty-two Barrels of Liquid Good Cheer—Local Option.

That the local option law has not worked any hardship on the people up Gardiner way is evidenced by the shipment of liquid good cheer that is going up on this trip of the tug Hunter. The shipment consists of an assortment of bottled beer and swikey, and is contained in forty-six barrels.

W. P. Reed, of Gardiner, shipped two tons of butter to this city yesterday to be reshipped to San Francisco. This is one of the largest shipments of butter received here this season, its value in San Francisco at present prices will be \$1,200.
